The Journal of African Real Estate Research (JARER) (ISSN 2304 8395) is in the process of reconstituting its Editorial Board and we are currently seeking members to help take the journal into a new and exciting direction.

JARER is the open access journal of the African Real Estate Society (AfRES) and is hosted by the University of Cape Town Library. The primary function of the journal is to deepen the understanding of African real estate markets. JARER also strives to facilitate dialogue between researchers engaged on research into real estate issues in Africa. The journal is published online biennially via the journal's website. Editorial Board Members will assist the Editor in stewarding the future direction of the journal and supporting the development of emerging academics who have submitted articles to the journal. In reconstituting the Editorial Board, particular preference will be given to female academics but all academics with an interest in African real estate are invited to apply.

Below is a list of responsibilities and eligibility requirements for Editorial Board Members.

<u>Responsibilities- applicants are</u> required to:

- solicit and review new contributions to
- the journal;assisting the Editor in identifying
- potential reviewers;provide mentorship to emerging African
- provide mentorship to emerging African academics;
- providing expertise, advice, and assessment assistance to the Editor;
- circulate calls for papers to colleagues, academics and professionals; and
- treat all authors with fairness, courtesy, objectivity, honesty, and transparency.

Eligibility– applicants should preferably have:

- a PhD;
- a good scientific publication record;
- a recognised expertise in real estate, particularly in emerging countries;
- a deep commitment to advancing academia in Africa;
- a thorough understanding of various research methodologies, both qualitative and quantitative; and
- the ability to dedicate the necessary time to fulfil the requirements of the post.

Interested applicants are encouraged to email applications to Journal Manager, Luke Boyle (<u>Luke.Boyle@uct.ac.za</u>) by the closing date.

Applications must include a CV (including a list of publications and your research interests). A selection committee headed by the Editor will review all the applications and send out acceptance letters by the 29th November 2019.
